<p><b>10</b> <i>Laetare Sunday</i></p> <p>Go out for a small treat to celebrate the midpoint of Lent.</p>	<p><b>11</b></p> <p>Encourage everyone to refresh any Lenten commitments.</p>	<p><b>12</b></p> <p>Look for signs of God's love and presence today. Have everyone share two of them at dinner.</p>	<p><b>13</b></p> <p>Prepare souls for Easter! Do an examination of conscience, using the Ten Commandments or Eight Beatitudes as a guide.</p>	<p><b>14</b></p> <p>Encourage everyone to do an extra chore and offer it for the souls in Purgatory.</p>	<p><b>15</b> <i>Family Night</i></p> <p>Take the phone off the hook and turn off the TV. Play board games and spend time together.</p>	<p><b>16</b></p> <p>Go to Confession as a family and experience God's mercy.</p>
<p><b>17</b></p> <p>Offer special prayers for catechists and anyone else who teaches the Faith.</p>	<p><b>18</b></p> <p>Go for a walk together and look for signs of Spring.</p>	<p><b>19</b> <i>St. Joseph's Day</i></p> <p>Today is a solemnity! See if your parish has a "St. Joseph's Table" or enjoy pastries at home to celebrate.</p>	<p><b>20</b></p> <p>Holy Week and Easter are busy times for parishes. Offer prayers for the priests and parish staff.</p>	<p><b>21</b></p> <p>Bring your donations box to its destination.</p>	<p><b>22</b></p> <p>Have a screen fast (from recreational use) from noon to 3, honoring the time Jesus hung on the Cross.</p>	<p><b>23</b></p> <p>The King is coming! Tidy up the house to prepare for the holiest week of the year.</p>
<p><b>24</b> <i>Palm Sunday</i></p> <p>Display palm branches -- signs of victory -- around the images of Jesus in your home to mark the start of Holy Week.</p>	<p><b>25</b></p> <p>At dinner, offer extra prayers for everyone coming into the Church at Easter.</p>	<p><b>26</b></p> <p>Go on a water fast today. Drink only water and pray for those for whom accessible drinking water is difficult.</p>	<p><b>27</b></p> <p>Get up 15 minutes early to pray as a family.</p>	<p><b>28</b> <i>Holy Thursday</i></p> <p>Attend a Holy Thursday liturgy or read John 13:1-11. What would you say if Jesus offered to wash your feet?</p>	<p><b>29</b> <i>Good Friday</i></p> <p>Pray the Stations of the Cross together, recalling Jesus' greatest act of love for us.</p>	<p><b>30</b> <i>Holy Saturday</i></p> <p>Light a candle and renew your baptismal vows together as a family.</p>
